A man attended a marriage seminar in which the speaker encouraged husbands to tell their wives they loved them. He realized he had been negligent at that point and decided to do something about it. So, on his way home from work that day he stopped by the drug store and bought her a box of chocolates. He then went by the florist and got her a dozen long-stem red roses. Then he walked in the house, handed her the gifts, threw his arms around her, and planted a kiss on her, and said, "Honey, I love you."

She pulled away from him and said, "Oh, George, it's been a horrible day. Johnny got in a fight at school. The washing machine broke down. I burned supper. And now, you come home drunk!"

What I learned in the States is this: one significant lesson, "Speak out!" I have heard many times from my friends here, "What do you want? Tell me." I see that direct and clear conversation eliminates numerous unnecessary emotional burdens — no assumptions, no miscommunication, and no misunderstanding. I believe it is very effective and convenient.

Traditionally, my Korean culture has taught me that modesty is the greatest virtue. So, I grew up in an environment where I didn't talk too much and avoided abruptly revealing my genuine feelings to others. I assume that this lifestyle values "understanding others" more than "self-expression." However, it is not hard to imagine that many misunderstandings occur when I try to read others' emotions. Reading other people's emotions is not easy. Sometimes it becomes time-consuming and exhausting to communicate with others because people, especially elderly individuals, do not directly express what they want. But I have been fine with this type of communication; I was one of them.

My son always ends our conversations before hanging up the phone with, "Love you, Dad," and I reciprocate. But I never told my mom and dad the same words, simply assuming that they knew my heart. Now that I've returned to my hometown, I realize that "telling what I feel" is important. With not much time to stay with them and limited opportunities to share my heart, I've come to realize I should share this with them. This time, I will say as much as I can about how much I love them.

Also, thank you, friends at Ward's, for this wonderful opportunity to reconnect with my parents. I am sending you my heart. Stay safe, and see you soon.


