I always have long flight trips because the only destination I aim for is always South Korea, where my parents and relatives live. So, I feel like they are very short trips. Really. Fourteen hours of flight and a bit longer stopover time do not bother me at all. It is always fun to travel because I know where I am going.

But this time, we tried different things. For the first time, we chose another country other than Korea. Second, I planned multiple stops to make a long layover in the lovely city of Vienna, Austria, for my family time. Third, I have always wanted to visit my missionary friend. Last, it was a part of my spiritual journey to answer the recurring questions of my call.

I shared the biblical meaning of Negev in the Old Testament the week I left. God called Abraham to leave for Negev. Negev was a barren field. The name itself indicated that it was dry land and an abandoned area. "Negev, seriously?" We may say this! But Abraham did not hesitate to follow the unknown path. He followed that direction anyway. Then later, we hear of Negev again when Abraham wanted to find his daughter-in-law. He sent one of his faithful servants to find the right person for his only child and heir; the servant brought her back to Negev, where the entire family resided. They stayed there, the land in which God had commanded them to go and live. In the Bible, Negev was not just a biblical location. It was a symbol that brought God's people to the sacred place and a spiritual moment to hear God's voice.

Why should they go to the barren field? That's because people cannot find anything else. In the wilderness, I learned this. There is no sound in the wilderness. I heard nothing. No sounds. Then once in a while, I could hear the tiny sound of the wind. It was not a similar sound that I am used to hearing or any everyday noise. But the wind blew through my unarranged thoughts and brought me a message. Deep in the night, I opened up my personal and spiritual questions to God and God guided me to some clues.

I would not pretend that this short trip taught me some spiritual secret and I would not bravely proclaim the message in a tone indicating that I know the answer. But what I can say is that the trip was undeniably filled with the guidance of the Holy Spirit (as you all prayed for me and for my journey), and I will share this wonderful process of knowing God's guidance and spiritual moments with you in the following services.

on vitality for local churches:

A message from Bishop LaTrelle Easterling:

For Christians, it really is "All About Love." The rest is commentary.

But while many Christians preach, pray, sing and write about love, most of the time we get it wrong. Love is too large to be measured or limited. A Hallmark card won't cut it. Love, we must understand, is not an emotion; it is an action.

But how do we define love? The theologian bell hooks teaches that love is "the will to extend one's self for the purpose of nurturing one's own or another's spiritual growth."

The Gospel makes it plain that the only way to demonstrate, pronounce, proclaim and prove that we are in relationship with God through Jesus Christ is that we love one another. But this love can't be in the abstract.

We must specifically and concretely build community and communion through the power of presence. In love, we heal divides by seeing the Imago Dei in everyone without exception. We become God's walking Word, not a word written on tablets, but the Word written on our hearts. We draw others to Christ by the light that shines within us. We must do love, be love, and give love to one another. Love is as love does
