Four preachers were visiting informally one day and began to confess their weaknesses to one another. One said, "My weakness is stealing. I have a strong compulsion to take things that do not belong to me." The second said, "My weakness is alcohol. I love to drink and I often drink too much." The third replied, "My weakness is women. I love beautiful women."

The fourth said, "My weakness is gossip. And I can't wait to get out of here!"

One Sunday in January during my sermon, I shared my personal take-away from a previous congregation in Carroll County. I grew up in a very traditional environment of spiritual life, attending formal services, participating in church activities, and trying to go to mission camp as much as I could. Consequently, my brain has automatically drawn a very traditional picture of what church life means. The key words that I think are mission, prayer vigil, soup kitchen, and spiritual disciplines like fasting, praise and worship, etc. Things with very special focuses and goals.

However, when I joined the men's group meeting at the church in Carroll County, I found something interesting. We just met once a month at a local restaurant. There was no agenda, no discussion topic, and no biblical conversation needed (anyway, none of them participated in my bible study meeting at the church). We simply ate, talked, and some of them enjoyed savoring wine. They did not drink a lot due to their pastor's presence, but it was a very relaxing and comfortable moment.

Can I say it was the communion of saints? We did not talk about God, church mission, and there was no church agenda. But church members gathered together and enjoyed dinner. Most of them faithfully attended those meet-ups; they were VERY faithful!

Last year, with some men at Ward's, I had dinner at Oscar's in December. I did not CHOOSE any person to invite, but just tapped random members' shoulder, saying, "I am going to have dinner this Thursday, would you join?" It was a light invitation without any expectation, thinking a couple of men would show up. Then, surprisingly, eight men attended, and we really enjoyed that night. Nothing fun or serious. Just eating dinner and some talk ... that was it. Then we all agreed to have another meeting. Isn't it interesting? What would you call this meeting? It does not need any name, though. No RSVP required. No commitment. Then they became good friends to each other, and good friends to me, too.

So, now I extend my invitation to all men in the Ward's Chapel community. Every 2nd Thursday evening, we will have a relaxing time at Oscar's. If you have time, come and enjoy this gathering.

Just show up at 7 pm on March 14th. And enjoy our friendship at Oscar's. See you then, men!

We recently have had our roofs scanned for water pooling and leakage. Congregational Vitality Pathway Update:

The Wards Chapel Vitality Pathways team is now actively engaging in community outreach endeavors as part of its overall goal of making disciples of Christ both within our congregation and the surrounding community at large. Specifically. our team is now working in conjunction with our church's Food Pantry team to host a breakfast event for our Food Pantry recipients. This event will take place on the next scheduled Food Pantry date, which is Saturday, March 16. Afterwards, the Vitality Pathways team will review lessons learned from the breakfast to decide what community outreach events to undertake in the future. It should also be mentioned that the Baltimore Washington Conference has endorsed our Food Pantry breakfast idea and provided a small sum of "seed money" to help support us in this.

On a related note, Vitality Pathways course study is now focused on the topic of discipleship and what it really means. Updates on this and other community outreach endeavors will be provided to the congregation in March.

Scholarship Opportunity: The R. Wayne Feezer Memorial Scholarship offered by Ward's Chapel United Methodist Church honors the memory of Wayne, an active lifetime member of the church, and is awarded annually to **church members** pursuing post-secondary education. Applicants are not limited to first-year students, yet when funds are limited, first-year applicants will be given priority. Scholarships of up to \$5,000 per academic year will be awarded based on the following: **church membership***, **church involvement**, community service, academic record, letters of recommendation, and financial need.

*Please note, that to qualify for the scholarship, the

applicant must be a member of Ward's Chapel United Methodist Church. Recipients of the scholarship in the past, whose parents were members, but were not members themselves, will only be considered for future scholarships while pursuing the same degree program as when initially awarded the scholarship.

Living Like Christ: A Banquet of Spiritual Exercises

This Lent, United Methodists are joining in a Banquet of Spiritual Exercises as they seek to "Live Like Christ." You can start the adventure at www.bwcumc.org/lent2024.

Written by the Rev. Rod Miller, Living Like Christ draws on foundational principles from the book and the movement of Positive Intelligence, also known as PQ. The Lenten online resource offers six weekly themes with devotional materials, a prayer and a prompt.

PQ, Miller said, "points to the mysterious and wonderful unfolding of God's love and power within." It is a tool for unblocking wisdom and assisting us in more fully becoming the people God created us to be. PQ stresses, said Miller, that it's not what you believe, but how you practice and live."

Part of this practice is participating in spiritual disciplines and taking time for devotional practices. Below are six prompts from "Living Like Christ" for you to consider this Lent:

Building spiritual muscles: Reflect on what spiritual practice you consistently do that feeds your soul. Which spiritual practices do you want to do more of? Don't feel like writing? Alternatively, take a picture of something that reminds you to make time for spiritual disciplines.



Gratitude:

Reflect on: "What and who am I paying attention to?" Who gives you every perfect gift? Are you relying on your own strength or on the grace of God? Don't feel like writing? Alternatively, take a picture of something that makes your heart glad.



Honoring your pain:

Ponder and then write your response to the prompt: "God, right now I feel..." Alternatively, take a picture that captures how you feel and "how it is with your soul."



Unblocking Love:

Take some time to journal your thoughts on the question: "What's preventing me from feeling/hearing/ attending to God's still, small voice?"

Or, if you'd like to approach this from a different angle, take a photo that illustrates a fear or anxiety that you're moving beyond.

Making Space for the New to Emerge:

1 Cor. 3.9 says that we are God's field. What does that mean to you? What do you believe that God is wanting to grow in you?" Or, if you prefer, go out into nature, and find a field or garden where God's magnificent work is on display and take a picture to remind you of what is possible when new things emerge.



Deepening Awareness:

In poetry or prose, describe the last time God granted you new insight. What needs awakening in you now? Take five to ten photos of the same thing, each time reimagining new ways of seeing that thing. How many new perspectives can you find?
