When I thought about that plan, I was not sure if Ward's Chapel families would like this event or not. First, it was a Good Friday, a day that was supposed to be solemn and quiet. Second of all, after this pandemic, we have less and less people come to church events and weekday rituals. But it turned out to be a very good meeting where church families gathered together and enjoyed a wonderful time of fellowship.

So, this fall, I plan to have a pilot program to reach out to our community. Since 2021, we had an on-going conversation about how to re-design our church ministry and mission. We had several group coaching meetings our Re-Formation meetings to brainstorm plans for our future. We started Family Fun Services, Coffee and Cars, Praise and Worship services, and we re-evaluated the current ministry and mission with coach Phil. Then, in 2023 we were selected as one of the churches to participate in the *Congregational Vitality Pathway* sponsored by the Baltimore-Washington Conference which can provide practical advice for envisioning our future.

Now, we are about to make a small step. We will have a community fellowship event, on October 14 from 5-7pm at our church social hall, playground, and even parking lots. We will invite our friends, families, and neighbors in our community. There will be good quality music, delicious food, a silent auction (donated by Mrs. Marlene Stivers), a Car Show, and more. It's all free. But most importantly, we will have FUN, by sharing wonderful fellowship and communion with our neighbors in Christ.

TRUSTEES

The Trustees have several irons in the fire since our meeting in mid-September. We will be looking into renewing our exterminator services and replacing the blinds in the Fellowship Hall. Large project-wise, we will be taking proposals from contractors for remodeling the bathrooms in the lower hallway and seeking estimates from roofers for leaks that need to be repaired.

We have water coming into the closet under the outdoor sanctuary stairs (aka 'the Creepy Closet), in the main stairwell going from the ground floor to the Sunday School classroom level, the old exterior chapel wall in the Narthex. These are all in the same area and I suspect they are all coming from the same source. Finally, there are multiple leaks in the organ chamber ceiling.

Two reminders:

The thermostats in the Sanctuary and the Narthex are set for Sundays to come on at 6:30 and go off at 12:30 p.m. The temperatures are preprogrammed and locked. The air conditioning will be maintained at 70° and the heat at 66°. It will operate automatically. Please understand that we cannot make everyone comfortable at their personal ideal temperature.

The sanctuary fans are preprogrammed to operate at the middle speed to cool the room. Ceiling fans are meant to rotate counter-clockwise to blow air across your skin for a cooling effect in warmer weather. Conversely, they should rotate clockwise when the heat is on. This distributes heat trapped at the ceiling down the walls and into the room.

PLEASE DO NOT TOUCH THE FAN CONTROLS OTHER THAN ON/OFF.

Offering is trending as planned

Pastoral/Staff/Office variance is the result of 5% salary increases, increased staff salaries related to Choir starting back up in 2023 and an increase in office expense. The office expense increase should just be a timing issue.

Overall expenses are trending as expected with the exception of the \$4,523 amount related to prior years services performed but not billed until 2023.

Comparative Analysis Adjustment - The \$4,523 was expensed in 2023 but the services were performed from 2017-2021. This amount is excluded for year over year analysis only. The \$6,565 represents one additional month of salary paid early for tax purposes. It is excluded for year over year analysis only.
