At the 241st Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference, held May 13–15 in Baltimore, I had the joy of sharing a piece of my spiritual practice through calligraphy, rooted in both my Korean heritage and my Christian faith.



The theme of this year's conference was "Rejoice in the Lord always" (Philippians 4:4). My calligraphy piece reflected this theme in two parts. At the top, I wrote in Korean, "Rejoice in the Lord" (주 안에서 항상 기뻐하라). Below, I included two ancient Chinese characters, Hee Rak (喜樂), meaning "Rejoice," written in the traditional Bronze Script.

These characters are hieroglyphic, symbolizing joy and celebration. "喜" (Hee) depicts musical instruments, and "樂" (Rak) shows a gathering table. Together, they evoke a joyful community—an image that reminded me of the Communion table at our Conference worship. My prayer was that we would all experience the joy of the Lord through shared fellowship and faith.

Calligraphy is a deeply spiritual discipline for me. Before writing, I grind ink by hand for about 25 minutes. This becomes my meditation time—a moment to reflect on Scripture and prepare my heart. Writing each stroke requires focus and repetition, sometimes hundreds of times. But through this practice, I find spiritual clarity and peace.

My teacher once told me, "You are not just writing words—you are carving them into your heart." That phrase still guides me. For me, calligraphy is not just art—it's prayer, devotion, and an offering to God.

I was grateful to share this expression with our Annual Conference and now with you, my church family. May we all continue to **claim joy**—as a mindset, a discipline, and a way of life in Christ.

Quiet Time prior to Sunday Church Service:

It has been great to come together and unite in worship and fellowship each Sunday at 10:00 a.m. Whenever you start something new or change something old there is an adjustment period. We have heard from some who miss the calm stillness of the 8:30 service as a time of reflection and prayer with God. Others preferred the fellowship at the start of the 11:00 service. As we come together as one, we are looking for ways to try to accommodate everyone.

The suggestion was made for a "Quiet Time" prior to gathering for church. There was careful consideration and discussion with the Trustees, committees, and individuals who need access to the sanctuary to get ready for the service. It was also taken into consideration that most of the congregation starts to gather approximately 15 minutes prior to the service for fellowship and to find their pew.

Starting in June, the sanctuary will be open **9:30** - **9:45** for a period of Quiet Time for individuals who want to pray, reflect, meditate or just enjoy the solitude. We ask others arriving before 9:45 and not taking part in the quiet time to use the Narthex for a time of fellowship. Individuals using the small parking lot and lift arriving prior to 9:45, please come in! Just be respectful of those using the quiet time.

Remember also that during the summer months we will be having refreshments and fellowship after the service.

<u>Yoga Class:</u> Yoga classes will be held the 2nd and 4th Mondays of each month at 6:30 pm in the narthex. If you need more info, please contact the church office. #### **Government Impersonator Scams**

#### Here's how they work:

You get a call, email, or text message from someone who says they're from the Social Security Administration or Medicare. They say something alarming — like your Social Security number has been suspended. Or maybe you'll miss out on a government benefit. To fix it, they say you must pay, give them your personal information, or put your money on gift cards and read them the PIN numbers.

The caller may know some of your Social Security number. And your caller ID might show a Washington, DC area code. But is it really the government calling?

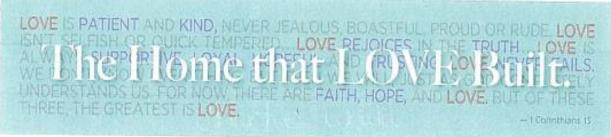
No. The government doesn't call people out of the blue with threats or promises of money. Caller IDs can be faked, so if you're not sure, contact the agency at a phone number you know to be true (not the one they called you from).

#### Here's what to do:

- 1. Stop. Don't send money to anyone who calls, emails, or texts and says they're with the government. Don't send them cash or pay them with gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency. The government won't demand payment that way — and you won't get your money back. If you want to reach a government agency, find their contact information at USA.gov.
- 2. Pass this information on to a friend. You may not have gotten one of these calls, emails, or texts, but chances are, you know someone who has.

On behalf of First Fruits Farm and those we serve, thank you for supporting our mission with your gift of \$2,000.00, which we received on 4/23/2025. Your generosity enables us to meet the escalating needs of our community and ensures healthy food is accessible to all, regardless of zip code.

Hunger and food insecurity affect far too many with more and more families, seniors, and others seeking assistance to meet their basic needs. Every year, the Farm is asked to do more but cannot do it alone, so your support is critical. Our commitment to donate 100% of everything we grow remains steadfast...nothing is sold, so gifts of all sizes truly make a difference.

Our 27th season has officially begun, with ambitious goals to meet the increasing demand in our sector for fresh, nourishing food. We have already planted onions, potatoes, and cole crops in our fields, with many more to come as we move into the season. Five greenhouses are growing tomatoes which will bear fruit throughout the summer into the fall – we anticipate each greenhouse will yield up to 25,000 pounds of tomatoes. In total, we aim to grow and distribute 6 million pounds of produce this season - 3 million pounds grown here at the Farm, and 3 million pounds of food that are procured as part of our 3rd party Food Rescue program. We are growing in almost every way – since the start of 2025 began, we've added 35 new Distribution Partners and are committed to say yes to those in need, as Jesus has called us to do.

Thanks to you our ministry is thriving, and we look forward to many exciting opportunities ahead, faithfully following His guidance on this amazing journey as we **GROW MORE – GIVE MORE – SERVE MORE**.
